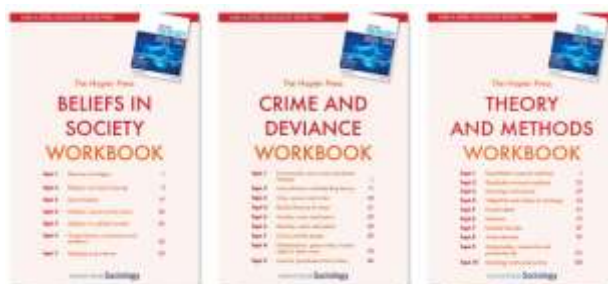

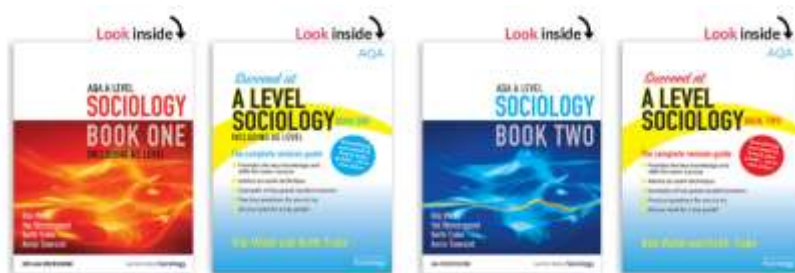
Topic	Functional View of the Family	Types of Religion	Easy Concepts of Beliefs in Society
1	<p>Functionalist View of the Family</p> <p>Based on the work of sociologists like Talcott Parsons, functionalists see the family as a social institution that performs essential functions for society. They argue that the family socialises children, provides emotional support, and regulates sexual behaviour.</p> <p>Conservative View of the Family</p> <p>Conservatives believe that the family is the basic unit of society and that it should be protected and supported by the state. They argue that the family provides a sense of stability and continuity in a rapidly changing world.</p> <p>Marxist View of the Family</p> <p>Marxists see the family as a product of capitalism. They argue that the family exists to reproduce the labour force and to provide a source of emotional support for workers. They believe that the family is a site of class struggle.</p> <p>Postmodernist View of the Family</p> <p>Postmodernists argue that the family is no longer a stable institution. They believe that the family is being replaced by a more fluid and diverse range of relationships.
