
Key Artist:

Andy Warhol


- Andy was born on 6th August 1928, In Pittsburgh, USA.
- He died on 22nd February 1987 (aged 59).





- He is most famous for creating 'Pop Art'.

Key Vocabulary:

Andy Warhol – An artist famous for the visual art movement known as Pop Art.

Artist - A person who creates painting or drawings as a profession/hobby

Pop Art – An art movement, which was produced using images from adverts and comic books.

Printing – Transfer a design or pattern to a surface.

Overprint – Overlapping a design or pattern on top of another.

Repetition – The action of repeating something. This could be an image, pattern or design.

Layer - Laying several objects on top of one another.

Key Skills:

- Children learn how to understand what a specific artist is trying to achieve in any given situation.
- Children learn why art can be very abstract and what message the artist is trying convey.
- Children learn how to interpret and present different textures.
- Children learn how to show an awareness of how paintings are created (composition).
- Children learn how to **overprint** using different colours and patterns.
- Children learn how to look very carefully at the methods they use and make decisions about the effectiveness of their printing methods.
- Children learn how to show awareness of the potential of the uses of material.
