Salvador Dali

- He was born in Spain on 11th May 1904.

Key Vocabulary:

Salvador Dali - A famous artist known for his technical skill.

Artist – A person who creates painting or drawings as a profession/hobby.

Surrealism – Is a style of art, which uses uncommon images.

Abstract - Relates to artwork that does not represent reality, but rather uses shapes, colours and textures to achieve its unusual results.

Detail - A small part of a picture that might need close study.

Observational drawing - Is drawing what you see, based on your perspective.

Shade - darken or colour a drawing using pencil lines or block colour.

Sketch - A rough drawing, often used when drafting drawings.

Viewpoint - What you can see from your perspective.

Perspective – The appearance of objects based on their position and distance from the viewer.

Key Skills:
