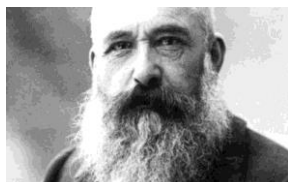


Key Artist: Claude Monet

- Claude Monet was born on the 14th of November 1840 in Paris, France.
- Monet started drawing charcoal caricatures when he started art school.
- He is known as an impressionist painter and the term impressionism came from one of his paintings called "Impression Sunshine".
- He experimented with light across the seasons and often painted the same picture at different times of the year.
- He died on the 5th of December 1926.



Key Vocabulary:

Impressionism – a style of painting using dabs of paint and colour, with visible brush strokes.

Landscape – a painting showing a view of natural scenery, like the countryside.

Watercolour – a type of paint which is used with water to give transparent colour.

Charcoal - Charcoal is used in art for drawing, and making rough sketches in painting.

Key Skills:

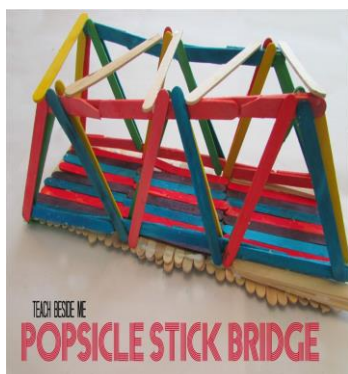
- Children learn to create different tones using light and dark.
