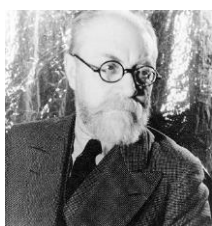


Key Artist: Henri Matisse

- Matisse was born in Northern France, on the 31st December 1869.
- He went to school in Paris.
- Some of his work has sold for over £15 million.
- His early work was full of bright colours and this style of art was called "Fauvism".
- He also changed his style and painted portraits and still life pictures too.
- Matisse died on the 3rd of November 1954.



Key Vocabulary:

Fauvism – Fauvism is a type of artwork known for its bright colours and shapes.

Masterpiece – A masterpiece is an important or impressive piece of art.

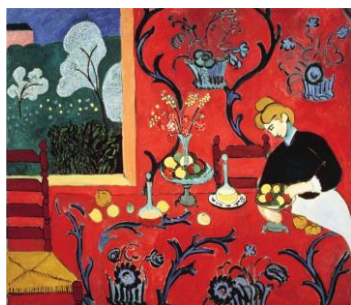
Portrait – A portrait is a picture or painting of a person.

Still Life - Still life paintings are a collection of objects. It could be fruit or flowers that feel soft, with vases, bowls.

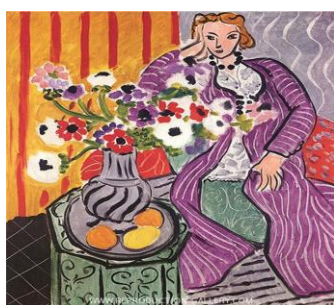
Key Skills:

- Children begin to learn to fold paper accurately to create various shapes and create effects within their art.

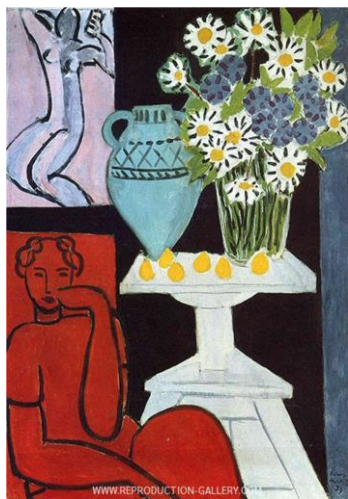

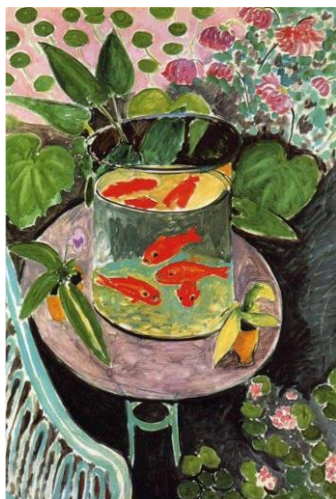
The Colour Red – 1908
