**What was The Great Exhibition?**

The *Great Exhibition* was organized by Prince Albert to showcase all that England and the Empire had to offer. It was held at *The Crystal Palace* between the 1<sup>st</sup> May 1851 and the 15<sup>th</sup> October 1851. Members of the public used the new railways to travel to London, which meant that huge audiences could attend from all over the country. Six million people came to see over 13,000 *exhibits*.

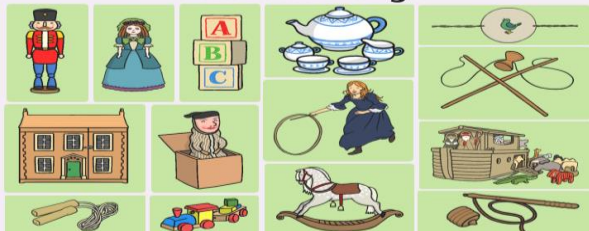


**What were toys and games like in the past?**

<b>Exhibits</b>	Publicly display things in an art gallery, museum or at a trade fair.
<b>Victorian toys</b>	Toys used and made in the Victorian era.
