

Key Artist:

Titian – Bacchus and Ariadne



- Links with Greek Mythology, Bacchus, the god of wine, with his followers on the right. He falls in love with Ariadne on the left after seeing her, so he leaps from his chariot at her, drawn by two cheetahs!
- Ariadne has been abandoned on the Greek island of Naxos by Theseus, who defeated the Minotaur on the island of Crete – you can see his ship in the distance sailing away. Bacchus raised her up to heaven and turned her into a constellation, you can just see the stars above her head.

- Pop artist and sculptor born in Brazil.
- Self-taught artist and well known for his use of bright colours and bold prints.
- Links with Brazilian Olympics 2016.
