

Key Knowledge

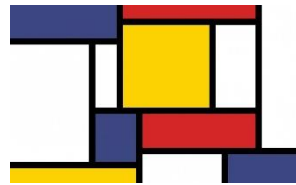

Freezing-Liquid turns to solid.

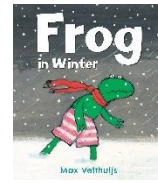
Snowflakes – a flake of snow.
