

Key Artist: Piet Mondrian

- Piet Mondrian was born in the Netherlands on the 7th of March 1872.
- His Father and Uncle were both artists so he was introduced to art at a very early age.
- He became interested in abstract art, using bright colours, lines and shapes.
- He often painted using the primary colours with black lines and white spaces.
- Mondrian died on the 1st February 1944.





Key Vocabulary:

Primary colours – The primary colours are red, yellow and blue, with these colours you can mix new colours. Printing – A printing or print is an impression made when you transfer what is on one surface onto another. Abstract art – Abstract art is when the artist uses shapes, colours and lines to express how they are feeling. Portrait – A portrait is a painting of a person.

Key Skills:

• Children learn to use charcoal, pencil, pens and pastels.

- Children become more confident in naming primary and secondary colours when mixing paints.
- Children learn to use a variety of techniques, including monoprint, block, relief and resist printing.
- Children learn to design patterns of increasing complexity and repetition.
- Children learn to print using a variety of materials, objects and techniques.
- Children learn to create textured collages from a variety of media.
- Children learn to suggest how artists have used colour, pattern and shape.
