Mexico is a country situated in North America. It borders USA to the north and Belize and Guatemala to the south. The Mexico and USA border is the second longest border in the world (around 2000 miles).

Main **religion** – Christian (Catholic 89%)

Mexico's Geographical Features

Mexico has mountains in the eastern and northern parts of the country, rainforests in the southern and eastern parts and deserts in the west.

Mexico has both a desert and a **tropical** climate.

Highest Mountain – Pico de Orizaba (5636m)

Longest River – Rio Grande (3034km)
